Joe Keller – nearly 60. A heavy man of stolid mind and build. A business man, uneducated, a man whose judgements dredged out of experience.

Kate – Mother, married to Joe. In her 50's. Has two sons (one is missing).

Jim Bayliss – a neighbor of the Keller's. Nearly 40. A self-controlled man, a doctor, cynical, a bit sad.

Sue – Jim's wife, 40, A nurse.

Frank Lubey – 32 years old, balding, a pleasant, opinionated man. Makes a horoscope for Larry, at Kate's request. He has a tendency toward peevishness but always tries to be pleasant.

Lydia Lubey – 27 years old, the wife of Frank. She used to have a thing with serious old George, but when he enlisted for the army, she gave him up and married Frank. She has three kids.

Ann – A visitor, used to live with her family at Jim's house. She is 26 years old. She is Steve's daughter and George's sister.

Chris – Keller's son, 32 years old, he lives with his parents and works in the family business. He is Larry's brother and similar to his father - he is solidly built but unlike him, he is very loyal.

Bert – a kid from the neighborhood. Plays a jail game with Joe. In Act 1, Bert asks Joe to arrest another boy for saying a bad word. Joe has given out that he has a jail in his basement. It's all fun and games until Kate comes in, angry, and tells them to cut it out. This jail game is one of the ways Joe has charmed the community into turning a blind eye to his crime.

George – Steve's son and Ann's brother, used to be Keller's neighbor. He's 30 years old – Chris's age. He is a lawyer. He lives in New York, unmarried, served in the army during the war, a pale man. He comes from a visit in his father's jail. He comes to stop Ann's marriage to Chris. He used to date Lydia.
